Jackie Ryan is the artistic director of the Brisbane Writers Festival. She has an abiding interest in culture that connects her work across forms and genres, from writing and research to performance, arts management, indie music videos and visual design. She holds a PhD in history and political science from The University of Queensland.

Jackie's book, *We'll Show the World: Expo 88* (UQP 2018), won two Queensland Literary Awards (Best History Book and Best Non-Fiction Book) and was shortlisted for *The Courier-Mail* People's Choice Queensland Book of the Year Award.

Her graphic novel series, *Burger Force*, has won an Aurealis Award and a Bronze Ledger and been shortlisted for the Russell Prize for Humour Writing. Her comedy writing collective, the Fanciful Fiction Auxiliary (FFA), has sold out a show or two here and there, including at Brisbane Powerhouse. The websites for *Burger Force* and the FFA have been preserved by the National Archives of Australia as sites of cultural significance.

Jackie's visual art has been the subject of several solo and group exhibitions and is held in public and private collections. She's represented by Onespace Gallery.

Writers on the Wall

As you enter the industrial chic of Brisbane Powerhouse for this year's Brisbane Writers Festival, your eye is drawn – powerfully, irresistibly – to a series of images that adorn the walls. *Is this for the Portrait Prize?* you wonder. *World Press Photo?* But no – as you step closer, as your vision adjusts in the cool dark of your surrounds, you begin to realise that these artworks may lie beyond your frame of reference.

The scenes are uncanny, fantastical, arresting. A lugubrious clown awaits a phone call. An influencer powers up her ring light as the apocalypse rages outside her window. An intrepid explorer makes a mesmerising yet mysterious discovery in a public toilet. A glamorous socialite heads to her getaway car after a fiery night out. Two striking figures face off in a hotel room, each considering their next move. You're taking it all in, experiencing a rush of feelings: confusion, elation, curiosity. But there's something else, something you can't quite put your finger—

Wait. Hold up a second. That clown — he looks familiar. He looks — no, that can't be right. But he really *does* look a lot like bestselling author and beloved former ABC radio presenter Richard Glover. And actually, having clocked this resemblance — too uncanny to ignore — you're starting to recognise that the other figures in these surreal tableaux also look suspiciously like beloved Australian writers, many of whom feature in this year's festival program and all of whom are alumni of festivals past.

Yes, yes: now that you've made the connection, it's like when one of those magic-eye images slides into comprehension. My god, you think – that's Anita Heiss who's running, laughing, towards Susan Johnson in the epic getaway car. It's Ceridwen Dovey – surely the very antithesis of an influencer – in the halo of the ring light. Kris Kneen eyeing themselves off in luxury accommodation. Winnie Dunn exploring the bathroom with the binoculars. And there's more, good lord, so much more: Debra Oswald squaring off against her inner critic, Michelle

Law unfazed by an arsenal of weapons, Kristina Olsson gazumped by ever-escalating technological obsolescence, Pascalle Burton majestically poised on landfill, Carody Culver as a nurse you may not recover from.

And it's only now that you understand who must be behind this. Because there could be only one person responsible.

Who else but Jackie Ryan – award-winning writer and visual artist, Brisbane Writers Festival artistic director, long-term collector of strange wigs – could coax such esteemed wordsmiths into sharp bobs, fake wounds and safari suits? Who else could transpose them into a visual landscape that blends a pop aesthetic with top notes of Armageddon?

There's a lot going on here, you decide. The Writers on the Wall doesn't just demonstrate what exceptional posers these authors are (although you should have known, of course, that each of them would inhabit their artistic alter egos with the same aplomb, poise and wit they bring to the page). The series also celebrates its subjects' magnificence through a new lens, playfully embodying BWF's mandate to put the festive in festival and reminding you of art's boundless capacity to entertain and enchant. Looking at these pictures, you realise, puts you in a better mood.

As you take a step back to reappraise Ryan's audacious collection, you conclude that your satisfaction is twofold. First, you can congratulate yourself on having successfully solved this literary version of *Where's Wally*. Second, you can revel in its unapploated display of authorial star power, its dauntless imperative to put writers where they should perhaps be asked to spend more time: in the spotlight.


















